CITING PRINT RESOURCES

Book with One Author

Author last name, first. *Title in Italics*. Place of Publication: Publisher. Date. Print.

Meyer, Stephenie. *Twilight*. New York: Little Brown and Co. 2005. Print.

Book with Two or More Authors

Gritzner, Jeffrey and John Schroder. Afghanistan. New York: Chelsea House. 2007. Print.

Book with More than Four Authors

Garcia, Jesus, et al. *Creating America: A History of the United States*. Boston: McDougal Littell. 2001. Print.

Article in a Magazine

Author. "Title of Article." *Title of Magazine*
Date of publication: Page numbers. Print.

Fay, Michael. "Land of the Surfing Hippos." *National Geographic* Aug. 2004: 100+. Print.

Article in a Newspaper

Author. "Title of Article." *Title of Magazine*
Date of Publication. Page Number. Print.

Brummitt, Chris. "Indonesia's Food Needs Expected to Soar." *Boston Globe* 1 Feb. 2005: A7. Print.

CITING ONLINE RESOURCES

HTML is only required if requested by teacher
*If no sponsor given write N.p. for No Publisher
** If no date of publication is given write n.d. for no date.

Entire Website

Author (if listed) *Title of Site*. Title of Site
Sponsor. Date of publication or update.
Web. Date accessed. HTML, if requested by teacher.

Riley, James A. *Negro Baseball Leagues*. Black Baseball, n.d. Web. 08 Sept 2009. <http://www.blackbaseball.com/>

Short Work from a Website:

(Appears as internal pages of a website)
Author if listed. "Title of the Short Work." *Title of the Site, Italicized*. Sponsor of the Site*; date of publication or last update**, Web. Date of access.

Johnson, George. "Plugging Into the Sun." *National Geographic* National Geographic. Sep. 2009. Web. 08 Sep. 2009.

Article from a Database

(example: iCONN)

Cite the source as if it were the Print version of magazine or newspaper article and add: *Name of Database*. Web. Date accessed.



Kaplan, Robert D. "India's New Face." *The Atlantic* Apr. 2009: 74+. *Junior Edition*. Web. 22 Mar. 2011.

Article in Online Magazine or Newspaper

(example: New York Times online)

Author if given. "Title of Article." *Title of Magazine or Newspaper*. Sponsor or Publisher of Site. (if not given use N.p.) The date of publication. Web. Date of access.

Hughes, Rob. "A World Class Talent Is Facing a Crossroads." *New York Times*. New York Times. 22 Mar 2011 Web. 22 Mar 2011.

Sound or Video Clips from Internet

Author. "Title of Clip." *Title of Program*.
Where it's hosted, publication date. Web. Date Accessed.

Murphy, Beth. "Tips for a Good Profile Piece." *Project: Report*. YouTube, 7 Sep. 2008. Web. 19 Sep. 2008.

Images from Internet

Creator if listed. "Title of Image." *Host*.
Web. Date Accessed.
