2. Superintendent's Report

Craig A. Cooke, Ph.D.

May 25 Presentation

Dr. Cooke reported a public forum will take place by Zoom on May 25th as part of the Board meeting and asked the PTO to spread the word. The meeting will begin with a few business items, followed by a 20-minute presentation and a question and answer session. Bill McMinn and Chuck Warrington of Colliers will be present and questions will be answered during the meeting. Chair Cawley noted the Board would like to do more workshop type models as opposed to two business meetings per month. Dr. Cooke noted December & February Referendum dates are being considered as opposed to November and there is a possibility other issues could be part of the Referendum (i.e. Island Ave).

COVID Update

Dr. Cooke gave a COVID update, reporting there are no active cases in the town. The reopening process will begin next week. CT Dept. of Health has advised to continue with masks through the end of the school year. Waiting on guidance for next year's reopening plan which has to be submitted to the State by end of June.
