## *Grade 10-11* Distance Learning Module 1: Week of: March 30-April 3

## Content Area: Course Title - Modified from Unit 3 Les Fables

## **Targeted Goals from Stage 1: Desired Results**

**Content Knowledge:** Students will review the perfect and imperfect conjugations as well as the present & perfect conjugation of pronominal verbs. Students will review the reflexive pronouns this week.

Vocabulary: specific to the classic children's story of Goldilocks, pronominal verbs, Vandertrampp verbs, irregular verbs

**Skills:** Students will be able to differentiate between the «passé composé» and the «imparfait» and will learn/review the adverbs relevant to each tense. Students will be able to discuss their daily routine using a variety of pronominal verbs in the present tense, and will then be able to use the appropriate adverbs to convert their daily routine into the past. [S1. Reading and interpreting texts at the intermediate level. S2.Deciding between the past tenses in context, such as talking about their personal past or francophone fables or folktales.]

**Expectation:** Students will be able to identify verb tenses (perfect, imperfect) & pronominal verbs conjugated in both of these tenses.
