1. Welcome/Introductions

2. Superintendent's Report Craig A. Cooke, Ph.D.

Dr. Cooke provided a budget summary sheet and spoke to the details of the budget guidelines, efforts funded and decreases. Budget was approved by the Board of Education unanimously (9-0) and by the Board of Selectmen unanimously (5-0) and it is now with the Board of Finance. Community workshop presentation took place this week.

Building timeframe – approximately 16 months. Board of Selectmen will pick a building committee comprised of citizens and board members from the 3 Town boards.
