Grade 6 Health - Puberty and Reproductive Systems

Targeted Goals from Stage 1: Desired Results

Content Knowledge: Puberty is the time in life when a boy or girl becomes sexually mature. It is a process that usually happens between ages 10 and 14 for girls and ages 12 and 16 for boys. It causes physical changes, and affects boys and girls differently. During puberty, your body will grow faster than any other time in your life, except for when you were an infant. It's good to know about the changes that come along with puberty before they happen, and it's really important to remember that everybody goes through it.

Vocabulary: puberty, hormones, estrogen, progesterone, testosterone, menstrual cycle, wet dream, reproduction, breast, vagina, ovary, ovum, penis, sperm, testes, scrotum

Skills: Recognize that puberty is a normal stage of life that all humans go through, identify the changes during puberty that occur in both males and females, recognize how sexual maturity enables the body to reproduce but people are not emotionally ready to reproduce for many more years, increase awareness of how knowledge and understanding about puberty can be reassuring about what to expect and what is normal.
