Targeted Goals from Stage 1: Desired Results

Content Knowledge: When in doubt, talk it out: Reporting Online Bad Behavior Students will differentiate between reporting and tattling with regard to in-person and online scenarios. Students will learn methods to block disrespectful and suspicious users online. This module ties together the lessons of being Strong (keeping information private), Smart (sharing with care and being aware of your digital footprint), Alert (being aware of phishing and catphishing schemes), and Kind (being an upstander, not a bystander).

Vocabulary: block, report, upstander, courageous, compromised account, student agency, trust

Skills:

- Identify situations that call for getting help or talking things out with a trusted adult.
- Consider what options there are for being brave and why bringing adults into the conversation is important.

Expectation: Students will differentiate between tattling (telling an adult to get someone in trouble) and reporting (telling an adult to keep someone from harm). Students will examine scenarios to determine whether the situation calls for reporting or not, and ways to respond to possibly harmful scenarios.
