Grade 6 Health: Growth & Development: Gender and Stereotypes

Targeted Goals from Stage 1: Desired Results

Content Knowledge: Gender deals with whether someone is male or female. Gender identity is about how someone expresses his or her gender. Despite the many roles men and women play in today's world, some people still judge others based on how they think males and females 'should' act. Stereotypes are ideas about how people will act, based on the group to which they belong. Many children grow up identifying certain characteristics as belonging only to boys or girls. Puberty is the time in life when a boy or girl becomes sexually mature. It is a process that usually happens between ages 10 and 14 for girls and ages 12 and 16 for boys. It causes physical changes, and affects boys and girls differently.

Vocabulary: gender, gender identify, gender expression, stereotypes, characteristics, male, female, gender role, puberty, hormones, endocrine system, ovaries, testes, testosterone, estrogen, progesterone, gonads, menstruation, emotional, pituitary gland, sperm

Skills: define and acquire relevant vocabulary to talk about gender identity, recognize gender stereotypes and identify ways stereotypes can result in unfair or even harmful situations. Recognize that puberty is a normal stage of development that begins between 10-16 years old. Identify changes that occur in males, females, and in both males & females.
