1. Welcome/Introductions

Sarah Drought called the meeting to order at 9:35 a.m.

2. Superintendent's Report

Craig A. Cooke, Ph.D.

Dr. Cooke provided an update on the school building project. Construction will not begin until 2024. Estimates received have come in over budget. Enrollment is predicted to go up slightly due to families moving into Madison and a projected increase in the birth rate. A construction firm was selected this week for Brown School and work will begin as soon as students leave the building for the summer.

The 23-24 School year budget will be shared with the PRC in January. Transportation fuel and custodial supplies will be increasing, as well as health insurance, which will be increasing substantially. We do not anticipate the need to request additional staff.

A discussion ensued regarding the shortage of paraprofessionals. Questions were raised regarding the State reading program (Right to Read). Dr. Cooke stated that Madison has applied for a waiver and the State has not approved the waiver requests of any local district. More information to come.

3. Scott Cochran, Madison Youth & Family Services

Scott Cochran provided an overview of the many services that MYFS provides to the community and the school district. Mr. Cochran has been with the agency since 2004 and the director since 2016. He also serves on the Academy Advisory Committee, noting the committee is seeking public input regarding the best use of the Academy School to create a Community Center.

Our newly installed "Fab Lab" is up and running and offers students many hands-on opportunities to create a wide array of things. Mr. Rice took the PTO meeting on a virtual tour of the Fab Lab and had students showing their projects and all the technology available for use.
