1. Welcome/Introductions

Sarah Drought called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m.

2. Superintendent's Report

Craig A. Cooke, Ph.D.

Dr. Cooke reported the start of the school year has gone smoothly and both students and staff are happy to be back. We have avoided some of the staffing shortages being felt in the State; however, we currently have an open special education position at the high school and a Spanish position at Polson. Dr. Cooke noted Spanish is one of the largest shortages in the State and neighboring districts also have openings. Currently working with 4 candidates. At the present time, Haddam-Killingworth (Region 17), Clinton, Essex and Guilford all have Spanish openings.

Dr. Cooke noted major enhancements have been made regarding school security and the response has been positive. Officers are already well-known to students and staff and at Brown and Ryerson we have extended the time the School Resource Officers are present.

Tecton Architects will be attending the October 21 PRC meeting to discuss the new elementary school-building. Good way to get community input and would like to hear from all buildings. Dr. Cooke passed out a flyer which will be finalized and distributed today.

The admin team is currently reviewing calendars for the next 3 years. We will need to incorporate a longer than usual summer in 2025 for the purposes of moving into the new school and to address any last-minute items. Looking to start early in 2024 and end early in June of 2025, with a later start in the fall of 2025.

Liz Tucker-Plasky spoke to the lack of homework since the start of the year, noting this was discussed at back to school night. Liz also commented on the extensive curriculum work done over the summer. Dr. Cooke added that he has not experienced this in his former districts and made mention of how often the curriculum is viewed on our website by other school districts.
